Responding to the Stop Campus Hazing Act

HR 5646 - Stop Campus Hazing Act

- The Stop Campus Hazing Act (SCHA), signed into law by President Biden on December 23, 2024, is the first federal legislation aimed at preventing hazing in higher education institutions. Effective January 1, 2025, the Act amends the Jeanne Clery Disclosure of Campus Security Policy and Campus Crime Statistics Act—now renamed the Jeanne Clery Campus Safety Act—to enhance transparency, accountability, and prevention of hazing across U.S. colleges and universities.
 - Mandatory Hazing Incident Reporting: Institutions participating in federal student aid programs must report hazing incidents in their Annual Security Reports. They are also required to publish a Campus Hazing Transparency Report, detailing hazing incidents and violations by student organizations.
 - Standardized Definition of Hazing: The Act introduces a federal definition of hazing, ensuring consistency in identifying and reporting hazing activities across institutions.
 - Hazing Prevention Education: Colleges and universities must implement comprehensive, research-informed hazing prevention and awareness programs for students.
 - Policy Transparency: Institutions are obligated to disclose their anti-hazing policies and list organizations found in violation on publicly accessible platforms, promoting informed decision-making among students and parents.
